CITIZENS' COMMENTS

Schultz gave an update on Metro transit. The new Metro Youth Mobility project has provided Kalamazoo Public School Students over 90,000 rides. Due to behavior issues, the program has eliminated bus passes and rides between 2:00pm and 4:00pm. With forthcoming software updates, Metro will be able to turn off passes to individual students.

In March of 2020 the Central County Transportation Authority (CCTA) will be asking voters for a renewal millage. The request will move the current .75 mil to .9 mil if approved. The Kalamazoo County Transportation Authority (KCTA) will have a millage in 2021.

Whalen announced that he would be leaving Disability Network and expected to have someone else from the organization to participate in the CAC meetings.

NEW 2020 STATE SAFETY TARGETS

Stepek reviewed the enclosed information regarding the adopted Calendar Year 2020 State Safety Targets.

KATS CERTIFICATION REVIEW

Stepek explained the federal certification review process. KATS staff feels the review went well and doesn't expect any major issues.

Stepek also asked for feedback regarding Transportation Improvement Program Amendments. Members discussed what they felt was most important for the public to know. Stepek requested that additional comments be sent to him.
